
Composition of Exchanges and Indexes



S&P 500

- Standard and Poor 500 Index (S&P 500).
- ▶ The index first originated in 1957.
- ▶ 1975 was the first year you could buy the index.
- Before that you had to buy each stock to replicate the index.
- ▶ There are 505 stocks in the S&P 500.
- There are more than a dozen companies valued at \$15 billion or more are omitted from the index as of 2019.

Fund that invest in the S&P500. FXAIX – Fidelity 500 Index Fund Expense Ratio = 0.015% ► To put it in perspective \$1,000,000.00 US dollars invested with FXAIX would cost \$150.00 per year. SPY - SPDR S&P 500 ETF TRUST Expense Ratio = 0.0945% IVV - iShares Core S&P 500 ETF Expense Ratio = 0.03%
